

(V.3A/191/7/61.—4 Oct. 1963.)

Her Majesty the Queen has approved a new uniform for the Royal Marines which will replace battledress and will also be worn as an alternative to blue uniform on certain occasions. The new uniform is of lovat shade and similar in design to the present blue Service dress for R.M. Officers. The buttons and metal badges are bronze and the cloth badges for other ranks are gold on green. A new design of khaki shirt is also being introduced.

2. From 1st April, 1964 in the United Kingdom and on a date to be decided locally abroad, the new lovat uniform will become the normal dress of the day in temperate weather. The present blue uniform of officers and other ranks will be retained for ceremonial occasions, other than those of minor importance when Lovat Service dress will be worn. On 1st April, 1966 the new uniform will finally replace battledress and the second blue uniform which is provided at present; there will, therefore, be a transition period of 2 years during which these uniforms may continue to be worn for certain duties. Revised orders of dress will be promulgated separately.

3. These arrangements do not apply to the R.M.F.V.R., who for the present, will continue to wear their current uniforms.

4. It is anticipated that all entitled personnel serving in the U.K. will be in possession of a suit of the new uniform by the 1st April, 1964, and that entitled personnel serving overseas will have one before the end of 1964.

5. Details of the revised scales of kit for new entries, the arrangements under which serving personnel generally will be required to adjust their kit to these scales, and of the new items to be supplied from service sources are given in the Appendices to this Order as listed below. Detailed arrangements for the supply and distribution of the new items will be communicated separately to the Units concerned.

- (i) Until further notice new entries are to be kitted up with shirts to the following scale:—
  - 3 No. Shirts, khaki, all purpose.
  - 2 No. Shirts, khaki, flannel, with collar.
  - 1 No. Shirts, khaki, flannel, without collar.
  - 2 No. Collars, khaki, flannel.
- (ii) The issue of khaki cellular shirts as part of the tropical outfit is to be discontinued for men entered on or after 1st April, 1964.
- (iii) After the initial issue, ranks may maintain a downgraded worsted suit instead of the serge suit if they wish.
- (iv) Junior Musicians are to be given 2 No. G.M. and 4 No. bronze lyres instead of Globe and Laurel Badges.
- (v) Adult entry musicians only.

2. *Other ranks at present serving who are:—*

- (i) *Not due for discharge before 31st December, 1964*, are to be given a gratuitous issue of a lovat worsted suit and 1 set of gold on green rank S.Q. and specialist badges. Kit History sheets are to be annotated when these issues are made quoting this Order as the authority. These men will be required to adjust their compulsory kit to the new scale at 1 above by 1st April, 1966, in the normal course of kit maintenance.
- (ii) *Due for discharge before 31st December, 1964*, will not be required to adjust their compulsory kit to the new scales and will not normally qualify for a gratuitous issue of a lovat worsted suit.
