

*5639.—**Naval Aircrew Ratings, Aircraft Handlers, Safety Equipment Ratings and Naval Airmen (General Duties)—Badges**

(V. 8/3177/45.—4 Oct. 1945.)

The badges described in Appendix I to this Order have been approved for wear by naval aircrew ratings, aircraft handlers, safety equipment ratings and naval airmen (general duties).

2. Flying badges are to be worn by rating pilots, observers and telegraphist air gunners in addition as shown in Appendix II to this Order.

3. Ratings who have qualified as pilots or observers but who are no longer employed as such may wear the naval flying badge of a rating pilot or observer as appropriate under the conditions and in the manner described in Appendix III to this Order.

4. Issuing prices of the badges described in this Order (other than those of the spare letters T.G., S.E., and H., which are given below) are set out in A.F.O. 654/44.

Note.—These badges are worn on being rated as pilots after successful completion of service flying training.

Rating Observers and Acting Rating Observers

Rating Observers and Acting Rating Officers
95A ... Wings, having in the centre an anchor surrounded by the Red
letter "O" and surmounted by a crown—for left cuff.

X.95B ... As above, see 100.
Note.—These badges are worn on being rated as Acting Observers after successful completion of Part II of training.

Telegraphist Air Gunners

96A ... Wings, having in the centre an anchor surrounded by a narrow oval of rope—for left cuff. Red

X 96B ... As above, but for left breast Blue

Note.—These badges are worn by T.A.Gs., 1st, 2nd and 3rd class.

On blue uniform (other than working dress) the flying badges described above are to be worn by C.P.Os. on the cuff of the left sleeve, $\frac{1}{4}$ in. above the centre button, and by other ratings $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. from the end of the left sleeve of the jacket or jumper without cuffs. On jumpers with cuffs, they are to be worn $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. above the point of the left cuff. On blue serge working dress they are to be worn above the left breast pocket of the blouse. On white uniform they are to be worn $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. above the left breast pocket of the tunic. If medal ribbons are worn the badge is to be immediately above the top row of ribbons. Flying badges are not worn on tropical shirts.

APPENDIX III

Wearing of Pilots' and Observers' Badges by Ratings who have Qualified as Pilots or Observers in the Royal Navy, the Royal Naval Air Service, the R.F.C., the R.A.F., or the Dominions Air Forces

Ratings who have qualified as *Pilots or Observers* at any time during service with the Royal Navy, the Royal Naval Air Service, the R.F.C., the R.A.F., or the Dominions Air Forces, but who are no longer employed as such, may wear the Naval flying badge of a Rating Pilot or Observer (Pattern Nos. 94A, X.94B, 95A, X.95B, as appropriate. The badge is to be worn in the same position as by serving Pilots and Observers—see Appendix II to this order.

2. Qualified ratings who wish to wear the badge must apply to the Commanding Officer for permission to do so and produce to him evidence of their qualification. If permission is granted, the notation " Pilots/Observers Badge A.F.O. 5639/45 " is to be made on page 1 of the rating's service documents.
