At present all ranks of the R.M.F.V.R., except those of the Commando Wing, when in battledress wear a red on blue R.M.F.V.R. flash, a pattern of which is enclosed. This has proved very unpopular with all ranks, and it is proposed that it should be replaced as soon as possible by the normal "Royal Marines" flash with the letters "V.R." in red on blue; the "V.R." sign being worn immediately below the "Royal Marines".

2. The R.M.F.V.R. from the training and operational points of view are divided into three Wings as follows:-

- (a) Commando Wing.
- (b) Sea Service Wing.
- (c) Amphibious Wing.

3. Apart from the Commando Wing who are authorised to wear the Commando flash and "dagger" sign, there is no method of telling to which Wing an officer or other rank belongs. Ranks of the Sea Service Wing are eligible for Naval Gunnery proficiency badges, but owing to the limited time they can spare for training, it takes them a considerable time to qualify for them.

4. C.G.R.M. considers that any smartening of the R.M.F.V.R. uniform will have a direct affect on recruiting and that the provision of distinguishing marks for the three wings will achieve this and also have an effect on the morale of the ranks themselves. C.G.R.M., therefore, proposes that approval may be given for the following distinguishing marks to be adopted:-

(a) For all Ranks except Commando Wing	"ROYAL MARINES" "V.R."
(b) Commando Wing	Royal Marines Commando Flash "V.R."
(c) Sea Service Wing	Dagger sign. White lanyard. Naval Proficiency badges as appropriate.
(d) Amphibious Wing	Red lanyard. Naval Proficiency badges as appropriate.




