Specialist Qualification Badges	To seek approval to introduce badges on the lines of the old "M.G. in wreath" with the addition of a crown or two stars or one star to denote 1st, 2nd and 3rd class qualifications, respectively. In place of "M.G." the appropriate initials will be used e.g., "SC" for swimmer canoeist. Approx. total No. of badges involved for initial issue:- Red 3,230 K on K 4,092 K on KD 12,276	At present no badges exist for certain specialist qualifications introduced in recent years (e.g. swimmer canoeist, assault engineer, etc.).

Specialist Badge for RM Band Service.	To seek approval to adopt the Army pattern brass lyre for wear on the upper part of the right arm as a specialist or "symbolic" badge of the RM Band Service (the lyre at present worn by Boy Musicians on the collar is not considered suitable as it is too small for an arm badge). To be worn only by Band Sergeants and below.	There is no method of distinguishing RM Band ranks from other Royal Marines when blue uniform is not worn. The Army band ranks wear a brass lyre on the sleeve as a "symbol" of their profession. A similar badge is desirable for the RM Band Service.
