

(U)\*†1080.—Uniform—Badges—Chief Petty Officers and Chief Wrens—Wearing of  
Collar Badges

(N/V3A/54/6/67—15 Sep 1967)

1. Gilt metal collar badges (Vocab No 35014) as worn by Chief Petty Officers with No 7 A Dress are in future to be worn by CPOs and Chief Wrens with the following orders of dress for ease of identification particularly by members of the other Services:—

*CPOs*

No 2 (Negative Jacket)	..	White Tropical Shirt, blue trousers.
No 7 (Negative Tunic)	..	White Tropical Shirt, white trousers.
No 10 .. .. ..	..	White Tropical Shirt, white shorts.

*Note.*—These badges may also be worn with blue working dresses (No 8s and 10 As) if desired.

*Chief Wrens*

Nos 1 and 2 Negative Jacket	White Tropical Shirt, blue skirt
No 10 .. .. ..	White Tropical Shirt, white skirt.

*Special Working Dresses:—*

- a. White Tropical Shirt, white skirt—Chief Wren Cooks at home.
- b. Overalls, Dental Surgery Assistant.
- c. Overalls, blue-and-white striped.
- d. Blue shirt when jacket is not worn.

2. The badges are to be positioned as for No 7A Dress, *ie* on each side of the collar of the shirt, blouse or overall, positioned centrally, with the side of the badge half an inch from the inside edge of the collar and with the crown upwards and at right angles to the top edge of the collar.

3. Ratings advanced to CPO or Chief Wren in future are to be given a free issue of one pair of metal collar badges. Ratings at present serving in these categories who have not already provided themselves with a pair of collar badges (cost—2s 6d a pair) are to do so in the course of kit maintenance at the first convenient opportunity before 31st December 1967.
