Introduction

1. This DCI announces the introduction of a new style white bush jacket and skirt for wear by female Officers, Warrant Officers and Senior Rates.

Background

2. The announcement that women were to serve at sea in HM Ships was made in Feb 90. Many of the then existing women's uniform garments were unsuitable for wear onboard ship, and although some interim designs were introduced quickly, it has been necessary to re-design or modify these and most other garments in the range.

Design

3. The style of the bush jacket is based on that worn by male Officers, Warrant Officers and Senior Rates but with cloth belt loops and tailored for the female form. The skirt is to the same design as the officers blue skirt. Both garments are made in easy care white polyester/viscose. The bush jacket has modified shoulder flaps so that either shoulder straps or badges may be worn as appropriate.

Out fit scales and relevant dress tables

4. Details of Tropical outfits/Kit scales are in ANNEX A and B respectively. Owing to reorganization of the Rank/Rate structure in the Nursing service and to closer affiliation with the RN, revised uniform Scale and Dress tables for QARNNS Officers and Senior Rates will be promulgated separately.

Introductory arrangements

5. *New entrants:*

- a. *Officers:* Will be entitled to a gratuitous issue of two bush jackets and two skirts on the first occasion of need. Existing outfits include two pairs of white trousers. The outfit for QARNNS Officers is one Bush jacket and skirt. Trousers are not included.
- b. *Ratings:* Artificer Apprentices and Technicians will be entitled to a gratuitous issue of one bush jacket and one skirt on the first occasion of need. Existing kit scale includes two pairs of white trousers. QARNNS Senior Rates are not issued with trousers.

6. *Serving personnel:*

a. *Officers:*

Appointed afloat: Officers with a seagoing liability will be entitled to a gratuitous issue of two bush jackets and two skirts when next appointed afloat to an area where tropical uniform will be worn. The outfit for QARNNS Officers is one Bush jacket and skirt. At sea, trousers would

normally be worn with the bush jacket. There is no change to the existing scale of two pairs of white trousers for RN Officers. QARNNS Officers would be issued with trousers, if required when appointed.

Appointed ashore: Officers (with or without a seagoing liability) whose next appointment is ashore where tropical uniform will be worn are entitled to a gratuitous issue of two bush jackets and four skirts. The outfit for QARNNS Officers is one Bush jacket and skirt. Trousers will not normally be worn ashore.

b. *Senior Ratings and Junior Ratings on Advancement to Petty Officer:*

Drafted Afloat: Those with a seagoing liability will be entitled to a gratuitous issue of one bush jacket and one skirt when next drafted afloat to an area where tropical uniform will be worn. At sea, trousers would normally be worn with the bush jacket. There is no change to the existing kit scale of two pairs of white trousers for RN Senior Rates. If required QARNNS Senior Rates would be issued with trousers when drafted.

Drafted Ashore: Those (with or without a seagoing liability) whose next draft is ashore in an area where tropical uniform will be worn are entitled to a gratuitous issue of one bush jacket and four skirts (QARNNS Senior Rates one skirt). Trousers will not normally be worn ashore.

7. Initial issues are to be made complete with the following accessories for wear on the bush jacket:

a. *Officers.*

Supply arrangements

8. The new bush jacket and skirt will not be stocked items. As from 1 Sept 95 they will be supplied by means of a supply/fit contract. Supply arrangements for new entrant Officers at BRNC Dartmouth will be managed by the Supply Officer in the course of initial outfitting.

9. Detailed instructions regarding contract supply of bush jackets and skirts to non BRNC new entrant Officers, serving Officers, serving Senior Rates, entitled Artificer Apprentices and Technicians and Junior Rates on advancement to Petty Officer will be given at the Clothing Stores in the establishments listed in ANNEX C. There may be some local variations but generally the procedure will be as follows:

- a. *Authorisation*: No work will be undertaken by the contractor or his agent unless proper authorization is provided. This is to be obtained by entitled personnel from one of the clothing stores listed in ANNEX C before making a visit to the contractor or his agent. Kit record books will be required when attending the clothing store. Authorization to order outfits/scales of bush jackets and skirts will be issued by the Supply Officer for handing to the contractor or his agent when attending for initial measuring.
- b. *Initial measuring*: Personnel are individually responsible for arranging appointments for initial measuring with the contractor or his agent. Locations of the current agent are listed in ANNEX D.
- c. *Interim fittings*: Fittings will be arranged as necessary between the contractor or his agent and individual Officers, Warrant Officers or Senior Rates.
- d. *Inspection and Acceptance*: Inspection of finished garments and acceptance by the receiving Officer, Warrant Officer or Senior Rating shall take place at a final fitting session arranged with the contractor or his agent. The contractor shall provide a 'Certificate of Satisfaction' (currently provided by the agent) before finished garments are issued.
- e. *Issue*: All issues are to be entered in kit record books.

10. *BR81 (RN & RM Uniform regulations)*. A copy of the scales and Dress tables attached to this DCI are to be placed within the covers of the BR until incorporated by routine amendment.

Introduction

1. This DCI promulgates full details of new badges and the changes in rank insignia and uniforms for QARNNS and QARNNS(R) Officers following adoption of RN ranks and titles which will be announced concurrently in a separate DCI.

Background

2. The unique design of QARNNS badges for Officer's has existed since 1902. A ratings section of QARNNS was formed in 1959 which has since adopted RN titles and rate badges. When DCS15 is implemented, personnel from all three nursing services will be working together in a tri service organization. The adoption of RN titles and rank insignia for QARNNS and QARNNS(R) Officers will include them in the RN rank and rate structure along with nursing ratings and establish a corporate identity within the three nursing services.

3. The QARNNS and QARNNS(R) will remain separate services identified by Queen Alexandra's monogram, and will retain the suffix QARNNS or QARNNS (R).
