1. The issuing prices of RN, QARNNS and WRNS ratings' and RM Warrant Officers', NCOs' and Marines' clothing and of tobacco and cigarettes have been reviewed in the light of current costs and revised prices are shown in ANNEXES B to F of this DCI.
2. The rates of Kit Upkeep Allowance (KUA) and Clothing Gratuity on advancement to Petty Officer have been recalculated and the new rates and amounts are set out in ANNEX A. A review of grants for special items for female personnel, and of the element for tights in KUA, has not yet been completed but the current grants have been included in this DCI for convenience of supply staff. Revised amounts will be promulgated separately at the earliest opportunity.
3. The revised rates of KUA and Advancement Gratuity, and the new issuing prices, are to be applied from 1 August 1986 as announced in DCI RN 144/86.
4. Although there have been no major alterations to compulsory kit scales over the last year the new rates of KUA allow for such lesser changes as the discontinuance of the pay book wallet and of separate shirts and collars for Class I and III ratings; the introduction of heavy wool jerseys for WRNS ratings and of the lightweight suitcase for QARNNS and WRNS ratings; and for the reintroduction of tapes and lanyard on modernized square rig.
5. Otherwise, increased prices are the main factor leading to corresponding increases in KUA rates and Advancement Gratuities. The percentage increase in KUA for RN Class II ratings is higher than for Class I and III mainly because of a greater price increase in their made-to-measure suits, and because of the changes in scale of white shirts.
6. Increases in the price of boots and the higher cost of footwear repairs contribute significantly to higher all-round KUA rates, and for Royal Marines personnel an added factor is the price increases of both blue and lovat suits. The increase of £5.58 in the VAT inclusive price of womens' overcoats is also directly reflected in their KUA rates.

8. VAT is to be charged on the sale of all cash clothing, tobacco and cigarettes except:

- In fleet establishments abroad.
- In HM ships outside territorial waters for more than 15 days.
- Where items are being purchased under the Personal Export Scheme (see BR 96, Article 0968).

9. To assist supply officers in highlighting the more significant price increases those greater than £1 (VAT exclusive) have been underlined in ANNEXES B to F; supply officers should note that decreases in prices are also specially marked (see Note 3).
