

The Commanding Officer is to arrange with the O.S.F.T. for the instruction in map reading of candidates for first class certificates of education, until such time as the schoolmasters are able to undertake this duty.

The examinations will be conducted by a Board of Officers composed in the case of first class certificates, of one Officer for every 24 candidates in each examination room with a maximum of three for any one room. The senior in a room should not be below the rank of Captain.

The superintending Officers are to exercise the greatest vigilance to prevent a candidate from obtaining assistance in his work. No person other than the Officers detailed to superintend the examination, the Inspector of Naval Schools, or his representative, and the schoolmaster who will give out the dictation are to have access to the examination room.

Examinations for second and third class certificates will be carried out on similar lines to those laid down for first class certificates. The Board may, however, consist of one or more Officers at the discretion of the Commanding Officer, and having regard to the numbers of candidates to be examined, the senior not being below the rank of Captain.
