- “ (a) Officers who have already qualified under Army Regulations are considered to be interpreters under Naval Regulations, and it is therefore unnecessary for them to again qualify. Even if they should so qualify they would not be entitled to a gratuity.
- “ (b) Interpreters already qualified under either Army or Naval Regulations to be required to re-qualify exclusively under Naval Regulations.
- “ (c) The names of present interpreters who fail in an attempt to re-qualify, or who decline to re-qualify, will be removed from the list of interpreters, but a reasonable time will be given in each case to re-qualify.
- “ (d) Marine Officers are to qualify exclusively under Naval Regulations.”

Cap ornaments for Bands, H.M. Yachts.

Insert new paragraph as 1099B:—

“1099B. A cap badge of special design will be worn by Warrant Officers, N.C. Officers and men of R.M. Bands *when embarked* for service in H.M. Yacht. These ornaments will be supplied to Bands before embarkation, and are to be returned into store when the band disembarks to headquarters.

“One ornament will be issued to each member of the Band embarked; a second ornament may also be issued for use by any men who take with them a second cap in a serviceable condition fit for wear.”
