

The gov't provides public goods.

Public goods are goods that when provided by the gov't to a particular group of individuals become available for others to use at zero cost and consumption by one person doesn't reduce the amount available for others to use e.g. roads, hospitals, schools etc.

Below are some of the characteristics of public goods.

Payment for them is usually indirect :- This is to say people pay for them through taxes e.g. the express highway is always paid for by the users.

They are usually provided by the gov't :- This is to say that the gov't is the one that mostly provides these goods to people since people are taxed and the gov't earns through the revenue.

They are non-rivalry in consumption :- This is to say one person using a good doesn't reduce how much of it is left for everyone else.

They are non-divisible :- This is to say you can't split them into pieces and hand parts like you can't split traffic lights and put green in Masindi Red in Masaka and yellow in Bwamba.
